The jailer in question has been placed on administrative leave since the incide and is pending the outcome of the internal investigation. This inspector reviewed face-to-face observations from the date of the in custody death until today's date and verified checks via vide. Since the in custody death, no face-to-face observations have exceeded the minimum 60 or 30 minimarequirement of minimum standards. The administration has met with all jail staff on proper procedure for conducting face-to-face observations. Directives were also sent via email to all jail staff with confirmation that each staff member understood the proper procedures for conducting face-to-face observations. The administration is reviewing video on a daily basis since the incident occurred well. Follow-up required – The administration will continue to monitor all face-to-face observations a daily basis. The administration will scan and email this inspector all face-to-face observations the next 30-90 days. If there is any discrepancies, the facility will be placed back into noncompliance
