



Experience developing and investing in the state of Texas since 2014

Highly experienced in developing, building, and operating transmission scale solar projects in Texas.

- Over 20 projects (6,000+ MW) under active development
- 17 projects in operation: 440MWdc

Investing in Texas and grid reliability

- Generated \$800 million of investments in Texas to-date.
- Paid \$3.7 million of land lease payments and taxes in Texas, to localities, counties and ISDs to date
- Produced enough electricity in Texas to power more than 45,800 homes with our fleet to date this year.

Soleil Solar Project Overview

725 MW Solar Project in Clay County

- Project equipment and design includes solar modules, inverters, transformers, racking equipment, foundations, possible battery energy storage units, internal access roads, and security fencing.
- Construction will begin in late 2024 and continue for ~ 1.5 years, with commercial operations estimated to begin in mid 2026.
- The project will consist of two array areas, connected by a 3mile powerline (Gen-tie)
- The project will interconnect to an existing 345kV Transmission Line, owned by Oncor, that intersects the project area
- This project would produce enough electricity to power approximately 70,000 homes





Soleil Solar Project Overview

Community Benefits

- Considerable increase in tax base for Clay County, totaling millions of dollars over the life of the project
- Soleil Solar is expected to employ 200-300 temporary construction workers, bringing local economic benefits to the surrounding communities and local businesses during the construction period
- Soleil Solar expects to provide 1 2 full time employees to operate and maintain the project
- Contributes to the resilience of the TX energy grid, powering homes and businesses across TX, without emitting pollutants or creating hazardous wastes
